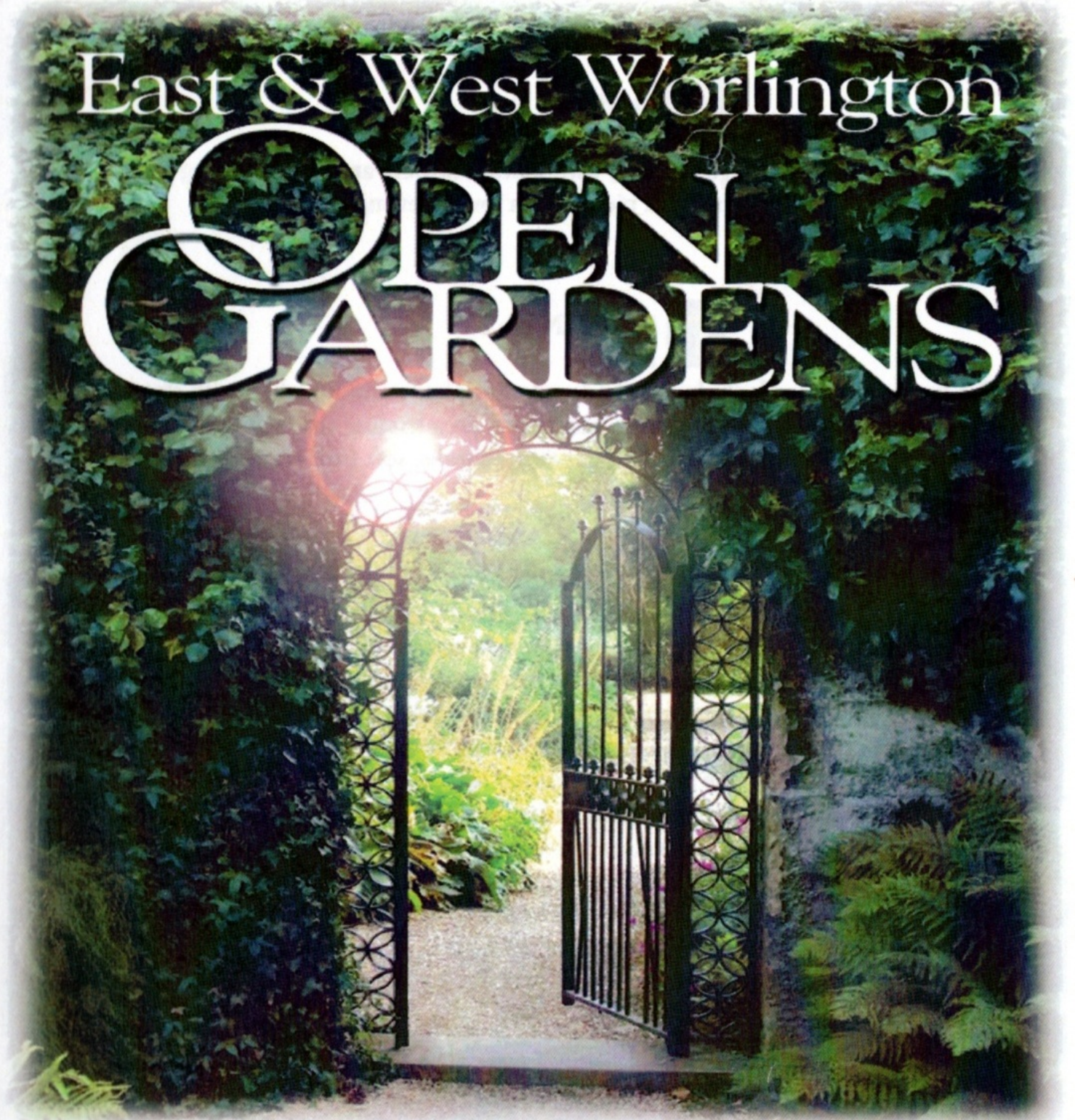

**GARDEN No.1
Town Cottage**

A typical English Cottage Garden, with mature flowers and shrubs giving a very colourful picture in a lovely setting



**GARDEN No.2
Avalon**

The front garden is planted with shade tolerant plants and mulched with slate for low maintenance. The rear garden has a lawn area leading through to a recently extended area that is planted with fruit trees, shrubs, soft fruit and specimen tree.



**GARDEN No.3
East Worlington House**

We moved here March 2006 (as you can see we are in the middle of a renovation project) we are thrilled to have taken on this beautiful garden in such a wonderful position. Lady Stevens, the previous owner for 50 years, was a very keen gardener and most of what you see today was planted by her. Since our arrival we have created the Ha Ha, to give an uninterrupted view from the house, cleared a path along the eastern boundary, mown paths through the wilderness, planted many trees, hedges and climbing roses, and created a small area of wild flower planting below the tennis court. Plans for the immediate future include mixed borders at either end of the lawn (as laid out with the stakes and longer grass) and a potager in the small walled garden to the north of the house. We are very lucky to have the help of Paul Tanner and David Thomas in the garden



**GARDEN No.4
Oak, Ash and Thorn**

A Traditional Cottage Garden, planted for all seasons and making imaginative use of every available space.



**GARDEN No.5
Little Dart**

Derek and Rosemarie moved from Hensley Farm to Little Dart 4 years ago. There are new plant borders, wild area with pond, small vegetable plot with large patio area. Beautiful views from all parts of the garden.



GARDEN No.6
The Old Poor House

A Cottage flower garden on 4 levels. Includes herbaceous borders, some shrubs and trees and a developing shaded area on the top level.



GARDEN No.7
Pheasants Walk

A garden for all seasons, the garden is set on an upward slope, the front garden has two magnificent fir trees, and a red maple tree on the entrance of the garden. The garden is still in a state of development, with interesting features around every corner, and not just the weeds



GARDEN No.8
Lower Cottage

A Cottage Garden divided into 4 areas, with mature shrubs and trees, one of which is a quiet area. The last part of the garden, 5 years ago was a small paddock which was full of nettles and dock. Over time we have put in a large pond, summer house, lawn, fruit trees, specimen trees, herbaceous and shrub borders, wonderful views. As you can see, an on going project.



GARDEN No.9
Knights Cottage

Steep garden on several levels, linked by a maze of steps and paths. Planted in a cottage garden style with a pond and a terrace 'potage' vegetable garden. Plenty of places to sit and admire the wonderful valley views.



GARDEN No.10
Town Farm Barn

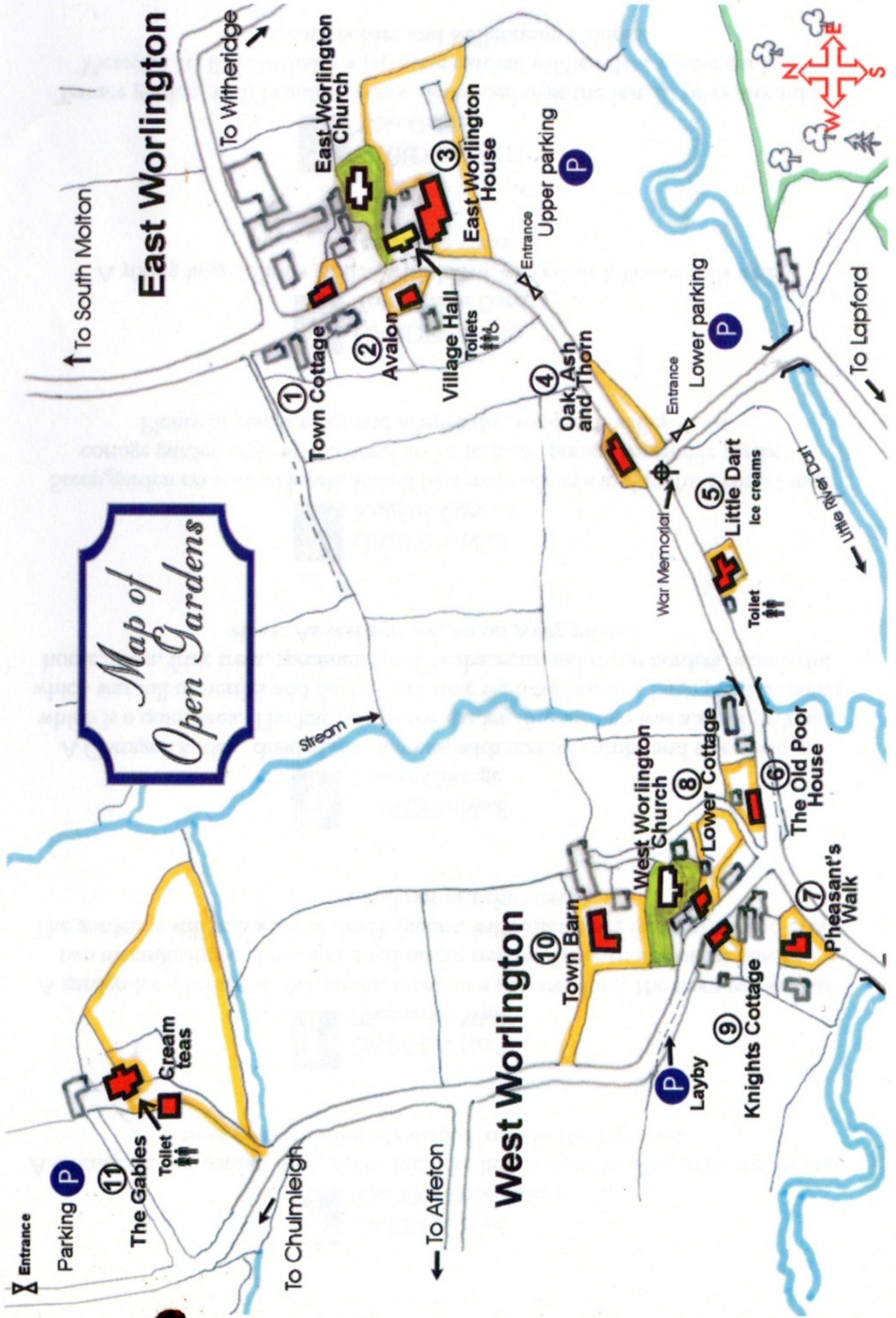
A young large hillside garden with lawns, an orchard, flower beds with extensive views.
