



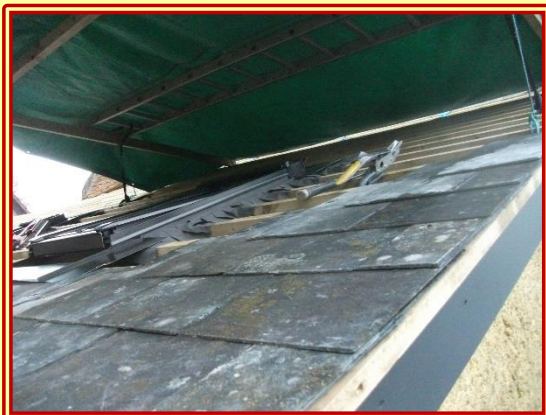

There has been good progress this week.

- Velux roof windows have been installed.
- The slates have been fitted to the roof and sealed against the wall with lead flashing.
- The electrician has completed first fix electrics.
- Work has started inside to insulate the North wall and the roof.

Parish Hall Kitchen Refurbishment Project

Windows, Slates, Electrics, Insulation



The Velux Roof Windows have been fitted. The windows will enable plenty of natural light to enter the kitchen. The units are double glazed and support our Environmental Policy by reducing heat loss.



Dart Electrics were on site on Monday and completed the first fix electrics. Cabling was laid for new circuits for power and lighting and electrical connections for the new cooker, dishwasher and wall mounted water boiler.



The roof has been covered with a natural recycled slate which supports our Environmental Policy and reflects the local building vernacular. Lead flashing has been used to make a water seal between the tiles and the walls.



The north facing wall is single skinned of block construction and insulation is now being added located in a timber frame. The insulation will contribute to our Environmental Policy by reducing heat loss.
